Lay Director's Report - What's Happening? What you should know?

Cursillo is about Commitment:

De Colores, I'm Tom Henry and I "made" my Cursillo in October, 1975, That's half true. I have never "made" a Cursillo, nor have you. "Made" implies past tense, something I have done, it's over. Cursillo, once started, is never over in this lifetime, unless we choose to ignore our call to the mission of Cursillo. What you have experienced is a "3-Day Weekend" that begins our Cursillo process.

What is the goal of Cursillo? With all the activities of the 3-Day Weekend, it can often be lost. Curisillistas are intended to be saints and apostles. "Saints are people who know God, who know God's love and grace, and who live their lives from this relationship." "Apostles are saints who have a mission to share that same knowledge with others."

Being a Curisillista is about personal commitment to spiritual growth and reaching out to others to share God's love. God has set some very high expectations for us to be saints and apostles. What are those expectations?

- 1. A personal commitment to continue growing in our relationship with God. We continue to grow in relationship with God for the rest of our earthly lives. Am I committed to growing spiritually? If you are not experiencing spiritual growth in your life, make a commitment to do something about beginning your growth process.
2. Personal growth can best take place in a supportive small group environment. We need to be accountable to others as we commit to grow spiritually. We also need the encouragement and support of a small group for our Christ centered, apostolic action. Am I a member of this type of small group? If you are not growing, supporting and encouraging each other in your small group, change your small group (keep the same small group, but change what you are doing in your group) or change your small group to another small group that will provide you with growth, support, and encouragement for your Cursillo mission

- 3. A personal commitment to sharing God's love with others. Cursillo is about "changing the world." We must bring others to know God's love through Jesus Christ. How am I sharing God's love with others? Are we making friends, being a friend, and bringing a friend to Christ? That's what being a Curisillista is all about.

What are the expectations of a Curisillista?

Please read, and act on the 2004 Curisillista Expectation sheet enclosed.

May God bless you for the commitment you make to Cursillo.

For those willing to make a written commitment to Cursillo and return the enclosed from, the following benefits are provided: First, and most important, your commitment to continual spiritual growth will continually deepen your relationship with Jesus. Isn't that what each of us want and seeks? Lastly, our commitment to Cursillo helps in bringing this gift to others.

A PRACTICAL GUIDE TO PALANCA

(Guidelines for communities and individuals)

Palanca is a Spiritual Expression. It is a response of faith. It is our response to God's grace in our lives. Palanca is prayer and selfless acts of love. It is not necessarily a thing or a bag of things. It is first and foremost ---prayer. This is absolutely essential for the success of any 3-Day Weekend. If this prayer is truly offered for the participants and the team, God will surely hear and answer that prayer. Prayer and sacrifice are normal for Christians, and it is the "best gift" that we can give on any 3-Day Weekend for all the participants.

It is never too early to begin offering palanca for the team and candidates of a Cursillo Weekend. In fact, our palanca is always desired for the Weekends held every week around the world. We can pray each Thursday through Sunday that the Holy Spirit will open and "lever" the hearts and minds of all those making their three-day walk with our Lord Jesus.

There are countless ways to make palanca. We can offer both informal and formal prayer, acts of corporate worship, Eucharist, and Stations of the Cross to name just a few. We can offer a dedication of ourselves through the work of our hands.

In Christian communities, Christ works to lever us in an especially effective way. Each one of us has something unique to give. Our palanca should move the team, the candidates, and us closer to Jesus.

As we approach Weekends through the year, we should rededicate ourselves in true worship of our Lord God, and permit His Holy Spirit to overflowingly fill us as we use this time to become more useful and loving instruments of His grace and peace. May our palanca move the team, the candidates, and ourselves closer to Jesus.

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNITIES & INDIVIDUALS

1. Use prayer as your first form of palanca to all Cursillo Weekends through out the year.

2. Make your palanca a selfless act and expression of faith.
3. Strongly consider acts of community participation rather than Xeroxed sheets of paper. This could be visible in a letter to all the participants from an outside community. This could be handwritten notes of support and encouragement to the candidates and the team. This could be a visible participation in serenades, mananitas, Closures, homecoming. This could be assisting the team during the weekend with cleanup, food donations, table decorations, etc.
4. Be sure that your community name or parish name is included on all visible forms of palanca such as a meaningful poster of support from a church community, handwritten notes to the participants, or a special type of bed palanca. This can be very meaningful to the recipients.
5. A very powerful form of palanca is regular contact with the new Cursillista after he/she has completed the 3-Day Weekend. Along with the sponsor help him/her get actively involved in the Fourth Day. (You don't have to know the individual personally to let him/her know that there are others who care.)
6. If you are not sure of how you can best offer palanca for Weekends talk with those who serve on the 3-Day Weekend Palanca Servant Community.
7. Remember that Cursillo is not about things.
8. Make sure that your palanca supports the entire team and all the candidates.
9. Ask yourself the following question: "Is my palanca really presenting the grace of God and the tools with which to share it?"
10. Reserve any personal gifts for Homecoming.

The Angela Center has been the home of the Redwood Empire Secretariat for a number of years. The staff at the Angela Center has been most welcoming and accommodating to us. They foster a caring, respectful, gracious, and non-intrusive environment.

There is a nice kitchen (WE CAN CONTINUE TO DO OUR OWN COOKING!) and a nice dining room that can accommodate 60 – 70 people. The space for the Rollo Room is great, and there is a lovely chapel. A large gathering room for the community is available in the same building as the candidate sleeping quarters.

The people at the Angela Center are wonderful. They know what Cursillo is all about and they freed up the June dates to allow us to schedule them. In addition they are providing space for us in January and March at no cost.

ASSISTANT LAY DIRECTOR SECRETARIAT

The date has been set for discerning the next Assistant Lay Director for the Anglican Cursillo of California Secretariat. It will be Saturday FEBRUARY 21, 2004, at 2:00 p.m. (prior to the Ultreya). The individual discerned will take office in May 2004 and serve for one year as the assistant (learning the ropes), and then move into the Lay Director position for the following year. Basically it will be a two year term serving in a leadership position.

The following qualifications have been established for this position:

- Possesses Leadership Skills**
- Understands and is Passionate about the Anglican Cursillo Movement**
- Currently Active in a 4th Day Group**
- Served as a Past Rector/a (optional, but preferred)**
- Willing to commit to a two year term (the first as Assistant Lay Director and the second as the Lay Director)**
- Served on a number of 3-Day Weekends in various capacities.**

This past year was the first time that a specific procedure was put into place to discern both a new Lay Director and Assistant with a set term of office. It has worked extremely well. Last winter Tom Henry was discerned as the Lay Director and Dick Brown was discerned as his assistant. Tom and Dick took office in May 2003 following Steve Shaffer. There was no Assistant Lay Director at that time. In May 2004 Dick will become the Lay Director and whoever is discerned in February 2004 will become his assistant. Currently Steve Shaffer serves as the immediate past Lay Director.

The responsibilities of the Assistant Lay Director are:

Function as the Lay Director in his/her absence

Work with the Lay Director and Past Lay Director in planning strategy and meeting agendas as well as long term goals.

Work as a team with the Lay Director, Secretary, Treasurer, and Past Lay Director as a member of the Executive Team.

This year has been the beginning of a year of transition for the Anglican Cursillo Secretariat. The basic organizational structure, along with clear policies, guidelines, procedures, and job descriptions, have gone through a major revision to bring into clearer focus the true purpose and method of the Cursillo Movement here in the East Bay of northern California. There still remains much work to be done. When we are finished, there will be more people involved in the various servant communities, records will be updated into one database, and communication will flow much smoother. Each Cursillista is being asked to make a commitment to service within the Cursillo Movement.

If the Cursillo Movement is to continue to grow and develop saints and apostles for Christ it is imperative that people step forth into leadership positions. Do you fit the criteria to serve as the Assistant Lay Director? The basic requirement is a love of Jesus Christ, a willingness to serve Him, a prayerful mind, an enthusiastic spirit, a loving heart, and a willingness to share your God given gifts and talents. Don’t wait for someone else to do it. Step forth now and say, “I am willing to offer my service.” Attend the discernment meeting on February 21, 2004, at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Richmond.

Candidate Applications

Are you planning to sponsor a candidate for one of the Cursillos in 2004? Here are some steps that will expedite the processing of a candidate's application.

1. *Download a current application from the Cursilloca.org website. Then the Rector or Rectora will have the same information for all candidates.*
2. *Sponsor, complete the back of the form and be sure to sign the front. Give it to the candidate, along with a stamped envelope addressed to Sherry Sheets, 4303 Bristolwood Rd., Pleasanton, CA 94588 - 4308.*
3. *Candidate, complete the front of the form and be sure to sign it at the bottom. Give the completed form to the clergy of your church for their completion.*
4. *Call to the attention of your clergy that in addition to completing their portion, they are to sign the front of the form. They are then to put it in the stamped addressed envelope and put it into the mail. (Depending on the Pastor, it may be in your best interest to wait for them to complete it, seal it in the envelope and then have you mail it.)*

The Secretariat is recommending that all Cursillistas be sponsor trained again as there are a number of changes for sponsors due to the relocation of our weekends. In order to be updated, contact UnoSheet@aol.com for the name of someone in your area that can provide this training for you.

When the application is received and they are approved as a candidate, a copy is made of the application and the original is sent to the Rector/a. Letters are sent to the candidate and sponsor from the candidate application coordinator, acknowledging receipt of the application. Later the candidate and sponsor will receive a letter from the Rector/a. with additional information regarding the weekend.

Let's start recruiting those candidates now for the 2004 weekends.

PUTTING "ACTION" INTO YOUR CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY

Kairos Prison Ministry began in 1977 at Union Correctional Institute in Rayford, Florida. Prior to 1977 Cursillo weekends were being held inside the prison. Due to logistics in a prison setting, the Cursillo method had to be altered. The governing body of Cursillo met with 9 men in Florida. Out of that meeting Kairos was born. Talks were changed, many logistics were changed, but the primary purpose has not. Table families are formed and 4th day groups are created. Reconciliation begins to tear down many walls.

It is not the church inmates that are invited to attend a Kairos weekend. It is the negative leaders in the institution that come. If their hearts can be changed, they have the ability to change the environment in which they live.

In 1985 Kairos came to California. Four of our Cursillistas from the East Bay Anglican Cursillo had gone to Florida to observe a Kairos weekend. Dick and Charlotte Angel and Rick and Sandy Ricardo came to a secretariat meeting to report on what they had experienced in Florida. I attended that particular meeting and my curiosity was peaked. It took a lot of footwork on the part of the Angel's and Ricardo's, but in October, 1985 the 1st and 2nd Kairos weekends took place at the Federal Correctional Institute in Dublin, Ca. Since it was a coed prison at that time, a men's weekend took place first and the following weekend, a women's weekend was held. Eventually FCI Dublin became a prison for women only.

Since then, Kairos of California has expanded to other State and Federal prisons for men, but FCI Dublin has been the only women's prison for Kairos of California. I have been a part of many of the weekends at FCI over the past 18 years. And over the past 18 years I've watched Kairos Prison Ministry grow. Today Kairos weekends occur in 28 U.S. states, as well as in Canada, England, Australia and So. Africa. I was honored to be part of an 11 woman team to start Kairos in Capetown, So. Africa in September, 2000. My trip was partially funded and fully supported by many of you in my Cursillo community. It was 17 days that has affected my life forever.

And now, I am again honored by being asked to lead a team of about 48 women into the women's state prison in Chowchilla. The weekend will be held Feb. 13-16, 2004. Am I recruiting team members? Yes!!! But, we all know that not each of us is called to enter the walls of a prison. However, there are many things needed in the way of Agape for the weekend. First and foremost is Prayer and lots of it. Palanca posters are needed. The only personal palanca that is received by the residents are letters and we

need lots of those. There will be 42 residents making the weekend. I, myself, use the little dayspring type folded notecards. The content should be of your support and hopes for them, letters affirming

Gods' love for them. They should begin with "Dear friend" or "Dear Sister" or "Dear sister in Christ". You can sign them however you wish, using your first name only, first and last name or just signed "a friend". Whatever you are comfortable with. The envelope CANNOT be SEALED. They must first be inspected by the prison staff and then the Agape team inside will seal them. And, absolutely nothing else can be in the cards. No stickers on the envelopes and no "tracks". You know, those "repent" type literatures. Pictures that have been drawn and colored by children are very welcomed. Many of these women are also mothers, so things from kids are cherished. The cutoff date for sending cards to the Chowchilla Kairos #1 is February 7.

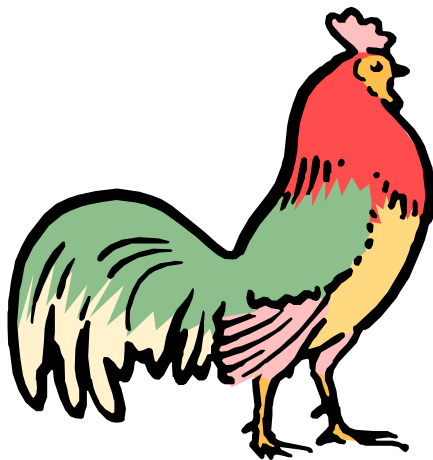
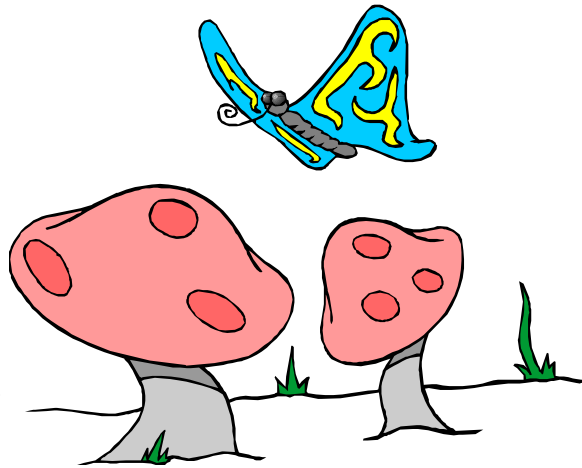
We will be allowed to use cookies on the weekend, but only store bought, sealed packaged ones at this point. During the weekend, each resident is given a bag of cookies to take back to her cell with her at the end of the 1st full day. They are asked to give out the cookies to any person that needs to forgive them for something. The 2nd night, they are given another bag of cookies, and are asked to give a cookie to each person that they need to forgive. So, as you can see, we need lots of cookies.

And finally, the almighty dollar. Kairos weekends are strictly funded by team members. If any of you feel led to help out financially, we are asking for donations of \$5 or \$10. Those monies can be sent to Emma Jones. Her address is 1521 Mendocino Dr. #17, Concord, CA 94521. Please put "Chowchilla" in the memo section.

The theme for the weekend will be "Faith, Hope and Love". We are going in on Faith to bring Hope to these women and to share Gods' Love.

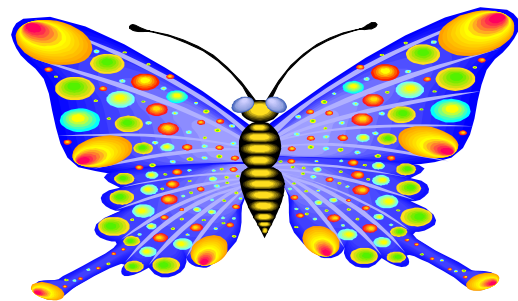
